APPEAL

In 1999 the Liverpool M.C. merged with LC&CC, donating their club hut near Blaeneau Ffestiniog. This small terraced cottage is a 20 minute walk from the excellent Moelwyn crags and a 20 minute drive from Tremadoc. It was well-used by members of LC&CC and made a steady income from outside bookings. Unfortunately, the wooden toilet extension at the back began to fall apart and became unsafe and unusable, and a year ago the committee reluctantly closed the hut. Dan-y-Mynydd is the only climbing hut in the area, and, judging by the results of our attempts to secure planning permission for an extension into a neighbouring house, the granting of permission for change of use to create another climbing hut seems unlikely. We feel we have a duty to the Climbing Community at large to keep this hut available to climbers.

Your committee has decided to rebuild the extension in block and slate with toilets and shower. Work has in fact begun, with the footings complete at the time of writing. However, the club can barely afford this investment out of present resources. Regular income from Tranearth and the added income from Dan-y-Mynydd should return our finances to a healthy balance in 1 to 2 years, but in the meantime.....

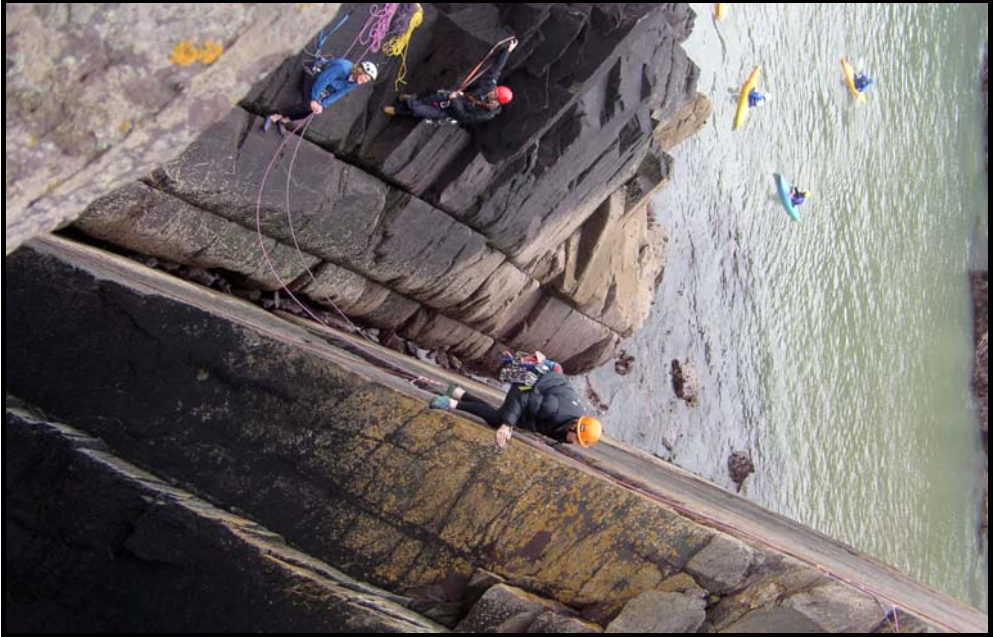

However the previous weekend Ken Tebay, John Banks, Phil McCool and myself had a good day on some ice in Cwm Idwal (*Central Route*). As the weather had by and large stayed cold for the intervening week we decided to go back for the weekend. Phil

McCool had to cry off with a cold, leaving Ken, Blacky and myself to meet up at Ogwen cottage early on Saturday morning. I was told that we were doing the *Appendix*, which at grade VI is 2 grades out of my league, but thought it was worth a try.

When we got to the route there were already about 4 parties on it, the first party, from London, having started at first light. Ken led the first pitch, which was running with water, most down his neck, at the cave under the icicle and all gathered at a good stance. Blacky led the second pitch joining the party above at the stance. (Their second thought that Ken was the spitting image of Don Whillans). Ken led through, across a hairy traverse to the top. Blacky brought me up to what was loosely called a belay, hanging from a bulldog, his shortest ice screw, another ice screw and an axe I think, and then followed Ken across the traverse. Eventually it was my turn to get onto the traverse and across it, which was made more exciting as on the extremely cramped stance my rope

had somehow got round one of my legs. Communication with Ken was impossible due to wind and the route direction so I couldn't get any slack to get it into the right position, coming off would also result in being up ended. However, I got across safely to join Ken and Blacky at the top. A brilliant and varied route with contrasting pitches.

Saturday night saw us in the Vaynol for a celebratory pint or two. However, based on the events of Sunday morning, before as well as on the climb, keep off the Enigma ale! Sunday turned out to be a beautiful cold sunny day. We were joined by Chris Wheatley and set off for *South Gully* in Cwm Idwal, a more amenable IV.
