SYMONDS YAT Aug 27th-29th

A CAUTIONARY TALE

The day started as normal. We drove to the car park and walked down to the crag. Now my knee dislikes going down hill, so I sat at the bottom feeding it tea. A team were starting to

climb *The Russian* (HVS). The leader was about 25' up. He shouted down 'pay attention' and the next minute he was falling (*I understand his gear caused him to flip over so he landed head first - Ed*). His two runners pulled out and he landed at the bottom. At first I thought he was alright as the rope was nearly tight, but sadly this was not to be.

I had done a similar trick about 2 years before, but Cath held me and my head just brushed the belay ledge. - there but for the grace of God go I.

I think he died in the first 5 minutes, but people tried to resuscitate him for about half an hour, until the rescue came.

I went for a smoke and as I looked across the river I could hear music and laughter and I thought: 'What a waste. What went wrong? A guy in his thirties, still a lot of living to do'. Have we got used to indoor climbing walls and sports routes with bolts every five feet? Have we lost the fear of flying and forgotten that death can be sitting on the next ledge, smiling? Gear is good, but not foolproof, sometimes it does fail. To me, the leader does not fall. How many people retreat from a climb nowadays? Not so many. They use gear when common sense would be better.

Cath was talking to some locals and this was the ninth death on this one route. (*We have tried to follow this up, but cannot find confirmation of this - ed*) Something must be wrong. So with these things on my mind, as Whymper said 'Climb if you will, but

remember that courage and strength are naught without prudence and that a momentary negligence may destroy the happiness of a lifetime Do nothing in haste, look well to each step and from the beginning think what may be the end.'
